7.2. Additional Prayers to Our Blessed Virgin Mother

7.2.1. BLESSED BE THY PURITY, may it be blessed forever. For no less than God takes delight in such exalted beauty. To thee, Heavenly Queen, Holy Virgin Mary, we offer on this day, our hearts, lives and souls. Look upon my beloved spouse, our children, on all those for whom we pray for daily, particularly those in our Sunday List and this poor sinner with compassion. Do not leave us, O Dearest Mother.

7.2.2. Flower Prayer to The Blessed Virgin Mary (By St. Gertrude the Great)

HAIL! WHITE LILY of the Ever-peaceful and Glorious Trinity! **Hail! Effulgent Rose**, the Delight of heaven, of whom the King of Heaven was born, and by whose milk He was nourished! **Do Thou**

³⁹ Numerous authors have been proposed for what is said to be the most popular Marian antiphon: St. Bernard of Clairvaux, Adhemar de Monteil, Bishop of Le Puy (ca. 1080 AD) and Peter of Compostela (930 AD). Herman Contractus, who wrote a number of well-known Marian pieces, is the author favoured by current scholarship. An interesting story exists describing its last three invocations. The Chronicle of Spire tell us that the final three invocations were added by St. Bernard (1091-1153). The hymn, so the story goes, originally ended with the word ostende. However, when St. Bernard was the Papal Legate in Germany, he heard the hymn being sung in the Church of Spire, threw himself upon his knees, and with a fit of sudden inspiration rang out with the words: O Clemens, O pia, O dulcis Virgo Maria. These three invocations have been repeated even since and for stones in the Church mark the place where the holy doctor knelt. Unfortunately for the story, the lines appear in early manuscripts before this event was supposed to have taken place.

What we do know for certain is that the Salve Regina was used as a processional chant at Cluny by 1135. Around 1218 the Cistercians adopted it as a daily processional chant and in 1251 as an ending to Compline. Both the Dominicans and the Franciscans also adopted it around this same time and the Carmelites used it for a while in place of the last Gospel at Mass. Gregory IX (1227-1241) ordered it to be chanted after Compline on Fridays. From the 14th century down to today it has been a part of Compline for the Latin Rite. Traditionally this antiphon is recited at Compline from Trinity Sunday until Advent.

This hymn is said to be a favorite of our Lady herself by testimony of those who have reportedly seen her in visions. One account concerning this claim relates a vision St. Dominic had. He was entering a corridor of the monastery to resume his midnight prayer vigil when he chanced to raise his eyes and see three beautiful ladies approach him. He knelt before the principal lady, and she blessed him. Even though St. Dominic recognized her, he begged her to tell him her name. The lady replied: "I am she whom you invoke every evening: and when you say, "Eia ergo, advocata nostra." I prostrate myself before my Son, entreating Him to protect this Order." (From the Life of St. Dominic, Lacordaire).

Many writers have praised this hymn. St. Alphonsus comments upon the Salve Regina extensively in his Glories of Mary, and Father Taunton writes: "Its fragrance lingers over our soul when, at the end of a long day, or at the end of any Hour, we place our prayers in Mary's hands, that she, the pure and glorious one, may offer them with all the power of a Mother's love to her God, to that Son, the blessed Fruit of her womb. Our prayers coming through her hands will be doubly acceptable to her Son, and we shall be the sooner heard for the reverence He has for His Mother".

It has also been recorded that the Salve Regina was recited by Columbus' men the evening before they sighted the New World the next morning.

Today this prayer is one of the final Marian Antiphons that conclude Compline in the Divine Office, and it is also used in conjunction with the Rosary. A partial indulgence is granted to the faithful who devoutly recite this prayer. The Traditional Collect, which is not part of the prayer proper, is given.

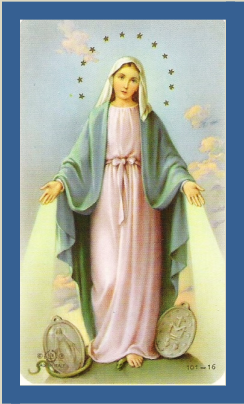
“Who is like unto God?” *(Silently say this: Nobody but nobody!)*

7.2.4. An Act of Consecration To Our Lady of The Miraculous Medal⁴⁰

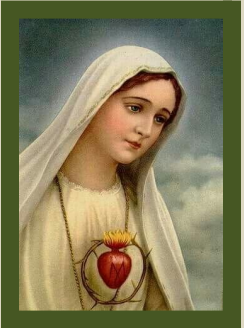

Dearly-Beloved Son, Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ to the true Faith; and that we will all walk and stay in the only path to Heaven paved by His self-same Precious Blood. Then cover us all, thy children with thy virginal mantle to protect us from the wickedness and snares of the infernal enemy. That God will imbue us with holy perseverance to stay in this same path up to our last breath. That when our earthly sojourn is over and when we stand before God’s judgment seat in our particular judgment, The Blessed Trinity may find us worthy of joining thee and thy court of angels, saints and holy souls in Heaven in giving Him glory, honor, praise and thanksgiving for all eternity. Amen.

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7.2.6. Prayer to Our Lady of Mt. Carmel⁴¹

O BLESSED VIRGIN, full of grace, Queen of all Saints, how sweet it is for us to venerate thee under the title of our Lady of Mount Carmel. It takes us back to the days of the prophet of Elias, when thou wast prefigured on Mount Carmel under the form of the little cloud, from which, as it increased, there fell a kindly rain, symbolic of the sanctifying graces that come to us from thee. Even from the days of the Apostles, thou hast been honored under this mystic title; and today we are filled with joy at the thought that we are united with those first clients of thine, and in union with them we salute thee, saying:



O Beauty of Carmel, glory of Libanus, thou purest of lilies, mystic rose in the flowering garden of the Church. O Virgin of virgins, be mindful of us in our misery, and show thyself as our Mother. Shed upon us ever more and more the living light of that faith which made thee, blessed; inflame us with that heavenly love wherewith thou didst love thy dear Son, Jesus Christ. We are filled with miseries both spiritual and temporal. We are straightened by many sorrows in body and soul, and we take refuge, like a child, in the shadow of thy motherly protection. Do thou, Mother of God, who hast such power and might, obtain for us from blessed Jesus, the heavenly gifts of humility, chastity, and meekness, which were the fairest ornaments of thine immaculate soul. Do thou grant us to be strong in the midst of the temptations and bitterness, which so often overwhelm our spirits. 7.2.7 Prayer For The Conversion of Heretics and Schismatics

Do thou, who art the seat of wisdom, illuminate their minds, wretchedly involved in the darkness of ignorance and sin, that they may know the Traditional Holy, Catholic, Apostolic, Roman Church as the true Church of Jesus Christ, out of which no sanctity nor salvation can be found. Finally, complete their conversion by obtaining for them the grace to believe every truth of our Holy Faith, and submit to the doctrines of the Traditional Catholic Church, that thus, being soon united to us by the bonds of divine charity, they may make with us but one fold under one and the same pastor, that we may thus, O glorious Virgin, all sing exultingly forever, "Rejoice! 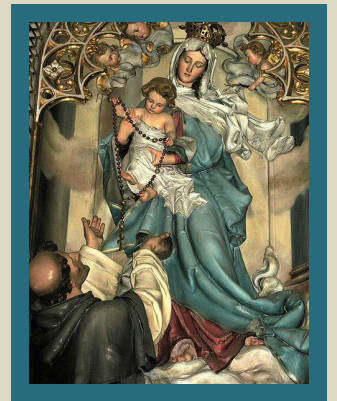
His wrath from us. Amen.

The 'O Gloriosa Domina' and Our Lady of the Privileges - January 9

In the year 1224 a miraculous event took place in the Franciscan Monastery of Alenquer, Portugal. There was a novice of innocent soul who committed a slight fault, and, for his penance, the Master of Novices told him not to leave the altar of Our Lady in the Chapter Hall until she had revealed to him the prayer she most liked. The novice is commanded to pray without ceasing until Our Lady gives her answer.

What caused the Master to give such a strange penance? Either he wanted to test the humility and obedience of the novice or, moved by some special grace, he was expecting some extraordinary fact.

The novice persevered all day, praying on his knees before the altar. As the night passed, he addressed Our Lady with heartfelt words and great

affection, saying: "O Most Holy Virgin, Mother of Pity, I humbly beg Thee to manifest to this Thy servant what the Master commanded me by obedience to ask of Thee. Blessed Mother, I will not leave from this place without an answer."

O great marvel! Behold the Queen of the Angels, who, inclining forward from the altar where she stood, responded: "Go, beloved son, and tell your Master that the hymn O Gloriosa Domina that the Church sings to me is, amongst all the prayers, the one that most pleases me. And to prove that what I say you is true, this, my Infant, who until now I held in my right arm, I now pass to my left arm. For this reason, you may go with confidence and give my response, for when all will see such an

extraordinary marvel, they will believe what you say. So go, and invite the Master and the other religious to come visit me."

The novice, consoled by such a great favor, thanked Our Lady and then went to tell what had happened to the Master of Novices. The latter, accompanied by all the religious of the Monastery, went to the altar in the Chapter Hall. Seeing that miracle, they all believed the words Our Lady had told the novice about the prayer O Gloriosa Domina.

Thenceforth devotion to Our Lady grew a great deal even until this day. From that day forward the Infant remained in the left arm of Our Lady, giving testimony of the miracle, for the signs remained in the sculpture that before the Divine Child had rested in her right arm.

To commemorate this miracle, every Saturday after Compline and the ringing of the Great Bell, the entire Monastery goes in procession with lit candles to the Chapter. With solemnity and devotion they sing the hymn O Gloriosa Domina.

It seems that this was the origin of the great devotion St. Anthony had for this hymn. He would intone it in his grand difficulties, such as on the night when the Devil tried to drown him in revenge for the great success his preaching had produced in Italy. The Devil took flight when St. Anthony sang this hymn.

The gothic Monastery & Church of St. Francis in Alenquer were destroyed by an earthquake in 1755; baroque buildings replaced them.

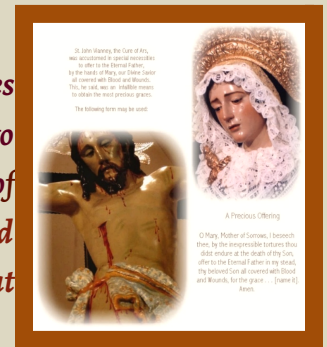

7.2.15. Novena To Our Mother of Perpetual Help (W)

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THE NOVENA TO OUR MOTHER OF PERPETUAL HELP is a booklet containing a set of prayers including the Roman Catholic novena to Our Mother of Perpetual Help, that was originally published in Jaén, Spain in 1899. It was then widely republished by American Redemptorist priests in 1927, then ultimately revised by Irish and Australian Redemptorist priests on 23 June 1948. The present booklet was mainly co-authored by the Australian priest, the Rev Leo James English, C.Ss.R, and Fra Gerard O'Donnell, and is officially presently used at the Church of San Alphonsus Ligouri in Rome each week, where the original icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help is permanently enshrined. IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH in the Philippines, the novena was first recited at the Redemptorist-run St. Clement's Church in La Paz, Iloilo following World War II[3] and is still recited every Wednesday. The practice of Wednesday novena has since spread to the Baclaran Church, a Redemptorist-run church in Metro Manila, elsewhere in the Philippines, and in the Filipino diaspora. The popularity of the novena became known due to the authorisation granted by the Holy See to propagate the icon, along with prayers which addressed the strengthening of marriages, healing of sicknesses, and helping find employment, thus earning it a quick following from the masses. In the United States, a 9-day televised novena is hosted at the Basilica and Shrine of Our Lady of Perpetual Help hosted by Catholic TV. St. Alphonsus Di Liguori is the Founder of the Redemptorist Order and Author the Mother of Perpetual Help Devotion. (Perpetual Help Redemptorist Fathers, Liguori, MO)

7.2.16.2. Act of Consecration To The Immaculate Heart of Mary (By St. Louis De Montfort) S

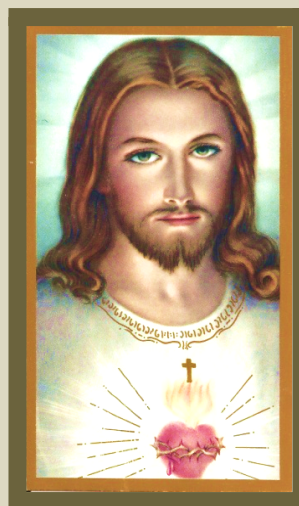

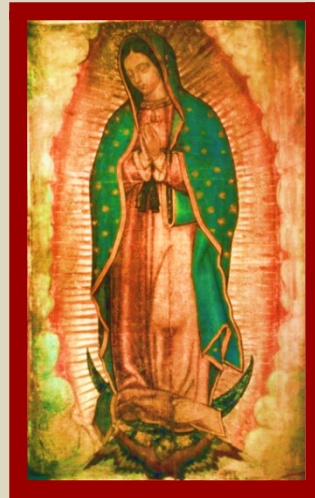

This Solemn Act of Consecration was printed on the back of the picture of Our Lady of Ollignies and widely distributed throughout all the parishes of the country during those perilous times. The terror and mass destruction that would otherwise have been visited upon them by the hostilities. And although a greater war followed, England fared far better than others. Ultimately Germany was defeated as Germans was suddenly and miraculously averted. 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In the picture above, Our Lady is crowned as Queen and dressed in beautiful royal blue robes lined with gold. The red robe symbolizes her virginity. In her sweet face you can see both her pain and her gentle love. Her heart encircled with thorns and pierced through with a sword representing her great sorrows. She points to her poor heart totally consumed with the flames of Divine Love for her Son and all her children.

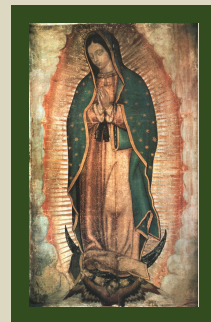

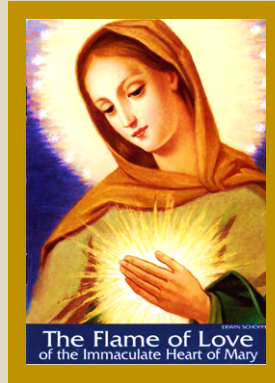

Inspired with this confidence, I fly to thee, Mary, Virgin of virgins, Mother of Jesus Christ. To thee do I come; before thee I stand, sinful, sorrowful and trembling. O Mistress of the World and Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer wretched me crying to thee in this vale of tears. Be near me, I beseech thee, in all my necessities, now and always, and especially at the hour of my death. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary. Amen.

* THE MEMORARE is a very popular Marian prayer that is sometimes attributed to St. Bernard of Clairvaux (1090-1153), Confessor, Abbot, and Doctor of the Church. While some of his writings do indeed echo the words of the Memorare, he did not in fact compose it. The prayer was first popularized not by St. Bernard of Clairvaux, but by another Bernard, namely Fr. Claude Bernard (1588-1641). More than likely the association of St. Bernard of Clairvaux's name with the prayer is a case of mistaken identity with Fr. Claude Bernard.

FR. CLAUDE BERNARD, known as the "Poor Priest", zealously dedicated himself to the preaching and aiding of prisoners and criminals condemned to death. Trusting his charges to the care and intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Fr. Bernard employed the Memorare extensively in his work of evangelization to great effect. Many a criminal was reconciled to God through his efforts. At one time he had more than 200,000 leaflets printed with the Memorare in various languages so he could distribute the leaflets wherever he felt they would do some good. Part of the reason Fr. Claude Bernard held the prayer in such high regard was because he himself felt that he had been miraculously cured by its use. In a letter to Queen Anne of Austria, wife of Louis XIII, he wrote that he was deathly ill once. In fear of his life he recited the Memorare and immediately began to get well again. Feeling unworthy of such a miracle, he attributed the cure to some unknown natural cause. Sometime later, Brother Fiacre, a discalced Augustinian, came to call upon Fr. Bernard. The good brother begged Fr. Bernard's pardon for disturbing him, but he desired to know how Fr. Bernard was getting along. Brother Fiacre then went on to say that the Virgin Mary had appeared to him in a vision, told him of Fr. Bernard's illness, told him how she had cured Fr. Bernard of it, and that he was to assure Fr. Bernard of this fact. Fr. Bernard then goes on to write in his letter that he was ashamed of his ingratitude in attributing the cure to natural causes, and asked for God's forgiveness in the matter.

FURTHER EVIDENCE of association of the Memorare with Fr. Claude Bernard can be found in the Bibliotheque Nationale at Paris where 18 engraved portraits of this holy priest have the prayer engraved below the picture. The prayer there is basically identical in substance with the Memorare we have today, and the heading simply says: ORAISON DU R. P. BERNARD A LA VERGE (Prayer of Rev. Fr. Bernard to the Virgin). In as much as some of these engravings are contemporary portraits of Fr. Bernard, his association with the prayer is very clear. It is easy to see how sometime after his death the Prayer of Fr. Claude Bernard became the Prayer of St. Bernard, and in most people's minds the Prayer of St. Bernard of Clairvaux.

WHILE WE have Fr. Claude Bernard to thank for promoting the Memorare, he is certainly not its original author. First, Fr. Bernard stated that he learned the prayer from his own father. Secondly, the prayer was known to and used by St. Francis de Sales who is 21 years older than Fr. Bernard. Thirdly, and most importantly, the prayer appears as part of the much longer 15th century prayer, 'Ad sanctitatis tuae pedes, dulcissima Virgo Maria'.

AD SANCTITATIS tuae pedes, dulcissima Virgo Maria is a rather long prayer that appears in a number of printed books and manuscripts from the last quarter of the 15th century and onwards. It appears in such works as the Hortulus Animae (15th cent.), the Antidotarius Animae (15th cent.) of Nicholas de Saliceto (Cistercian abbot of Bomgart, near Strasbourg), and the Precationum piarum Enchiridion, compiled around 1570 by Simon Verepaeus. The Memorare is an integral part of the text in each case. Exactly when the Memorare was extracted from this longer prayer has not yet been determined, but it likely occurred in the later part of the 16th century, around the time of Fr. Bernard and his father.

SINCE THE later part of the 16th century several variants of the Memorare have appeared such as that found in the Coeleste Palmetum below. It is also found embedded in the Ave augustissima. The exact wording of the prayer stabilized during the 19th century to that given above and was first indulged by Pope Pius IX in 1846.
